DULCE ESPERANZA 2023

Our program opened on July 5th and ended on August 18th. We had 80 students register with over ten teen leaders helping to support the program. This year, a special grant from the Orange County Youth Bureau funded workshops on safety for children. Five of the teens presented topics on safety to children. They were able to practice their teaching skills during the summer and spring.

Reading Scores



The morning focus on academics has paid offchildren's reading scores improved by:

- <u>Letter Sounds</u>: On average, there was a
 43% improvement for 23 students
- Word Reading: On average, there was a 26% improvement for 34 students
- Letter Names: On average, there was a 21% improvement for 10 students
- Passage: On average, there was a 23% improvement for 50 students














Wickham Works displayed the artwork done by the children during the summer. The students enjoyed helping during the event.


CORE VALUES
